Winnipeg, Oct. 31.-The Board of Education for Manitoba has decided to abolish the use of copybooks in teaching writing to adopt the commercial college system. This is regarded as an important innovation and its results will be watched with interest.

AN INTERESTING FIND.
The skeleton of a prehistoric animal, forty feet long and twenty-two feet in height, has been found in the Bad Lands near Osgoog, connected with the American Museum of Natural History.
