THAT SCHOOL CLAUSE.

Dr. Pugsley Talks on the Objectionable Section in the Anatomy Bill.

Attorney General Pugsley returned from Ottawa, Saturday, in company. Dr. Pugsley said that the annual English surgeon-general conference, which is generally held in London, had just closed, and that the latest clause in the bill relating to education, in providing for the appropriation of the government monies, including the proceeds of the lottery, for the support of the schools—whereas, in the original bill, the schools—were struck out, was to be satisfactory to the western members supporting the bill, and the English-speaking supporters. But it did not so clearly bring the French monarch to the front, as the English members, who are so numerous, are so clear that, if the minority of the ratepayers in a district try themselves for support of a separate school, they should also receive a fair proportion of the government monies.

Who the favor changing the bill, he held that the appointment of public monies, between the public schools and the private schools, should be left entirely to the provincial governments to deal with, as it is the opinion of the clause which is now proposed to strike out, the provisions of the act providing for the support of the schools by the Northwest Territories Act, 1875, and which have been in force in the Northwest Territories.

In referring to the re-adjustment of provincial subsidies, and attending of the question, relating to the Indian school award, Attorney General Pugsley said that both the English and French members were making satisfactory progress, and he thought that it was not many days, an important and satisfactory announcement would be made in regard to them.
