# THE CONDITIONS IN THE STOCK MARKET

The Public Is As Yet Only a Small Element—Wealthy Speculative Interests in Evidence—Prices Measuring up to a New Standard.

(New York Globe.)

The statement was in this column a week ago that one of the other of two different types of a rising speculation was likely to be seen in the immediate future. Either there would be an advance short in duration, but setting a furious pace while it lasted, or a gradual movement in which the distribution of stocks from the hands of the larger Wall Street interests would proceed slowly, and which might, therefore, be expected to continue over a longer period. It is evident that what has been witnessed for the past week is a market of the latter rather than of the former character. The level of prices, taking a general average, has risen forty to fifty per cent, and among individual stocks there has been great irregularity, indicating that speculative forces have no means been of one mind as to the immediate tendency of prices. In other words it has been very far from a market of the sort of 1901 and 1902, where the outside public, to use a favorite phrase, "took the bit in its teeth" and swept away all opposition. **GULF PORTS AS COMPETITORS**

Gaining More and More of the Export Trade in Breadstuffs.

BALTIMORE, Jan. 20.—That southern ports are increasing their importance as exporters of breadstuffs is shown in this week's issue of the Manufacturer's Record, which says:

"During the twelve months of the past calendar year the value of breadstuffs exports from the country increased over that of the preceding year from \$62,231,812 to \$146,110,992, or by \$83,879,180, equal to 38 per cent. The increase at leading ports was as follows:
