Somers Sued for \$20,000.

Cleveland, July 18—Joseph L. Birmingham, former manager of the Cleveland American League baseball team, has filed suit for \$20,000 against Charles W. Somers, owner of the club, to recover salary and damages alleged to be due because Somers terminated his contract, discharged him as manager and released him as a member of the team.

Birmingha's petition says his contract was for the seasons of 1914, 1915 and 1916 at \$6,000 a year, with \$1,500 additional as an option on his services and that it contained no ten-day clause, being what has come to be termed an "iron-clad" contract. He says he was paid his salary to June 1, 1915, and claims it is due until October 10, 1916.
