Hoboes Invite Marie To Dine With Members

OHAMA, Neb., Nov. 11.—And now comes the hobo, last but not least, of those who would honor Queen Marie of Rumania. Although censured as a "disseminator of organized propaganda for monarchy" by delegates to the National Hobo Convention here, the organization apparently is willing to forego its views temporarily and have invited the Queen to lunch with them on Monday. "We want Queen Marie to visit us," James Howe, hobo-issuism, told the delegates. "Maybe we can do her a lot of good. But we consider ourselves better than any Queen. The invitation does not imply that the Queen is considered a member of the National Hobo organization, although she is riding free." A deficit of 33 cents in the treasury of the National organization, the problem of getting high-calibre officers in some eastern chapters to take the place of those who have absconded with funds ranging from \$5 to \$15, and a program to educate the American public toward better working conditions for the hobo were the principal topics of discussion at the convention today.
