### POWER BODY TO SIGN CONTRACT WITH NEWCASTLE

Much Routine at Meeting Here of Provincial Board

The New Brunswick Electric Power Commission continued its sittings this morning. The sessions will continue this afternoon.

Hon. E. A. Reilly, chairman, said that at a conference with the representatives of the Town of Newcastle a satisfactory agreement had been reached and the contract would be renewed for one year from Jan. 10.

#### LOCAL DELEGATION.

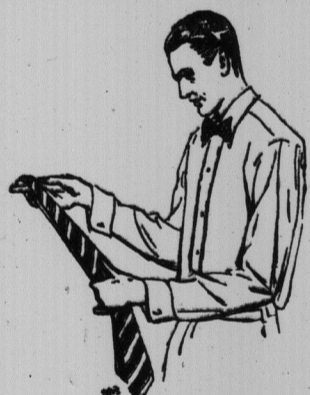
A delegation from the Civic Power Commission supported their request that the Provincial Commission approve of the extension of the civic system to the Saint John Dry Dock and Shipbuilding Co. plant, as required by the act. This has not been considered yet.

A request from the residents of Buctouche, St. Francis, St. Thomas, Cote de la Croix, Somerville, Cote D'Or and Grand Digue for the extension of the hydro lines from Shediac to Buctouche was received. It involves construction of about 30 miles of wire. The request was referred to the chief engineer for a report.

It was reported that a settlement had been arrived at with the City of Moncton for the right of way expatriated by the Commission.

#### SACKVILLE PETITION.

A petition from Sackville, forwarded by C. W. Fawcett, asking for terms on which the commission would supply electric current to the Eastern Electric Company, which supplies

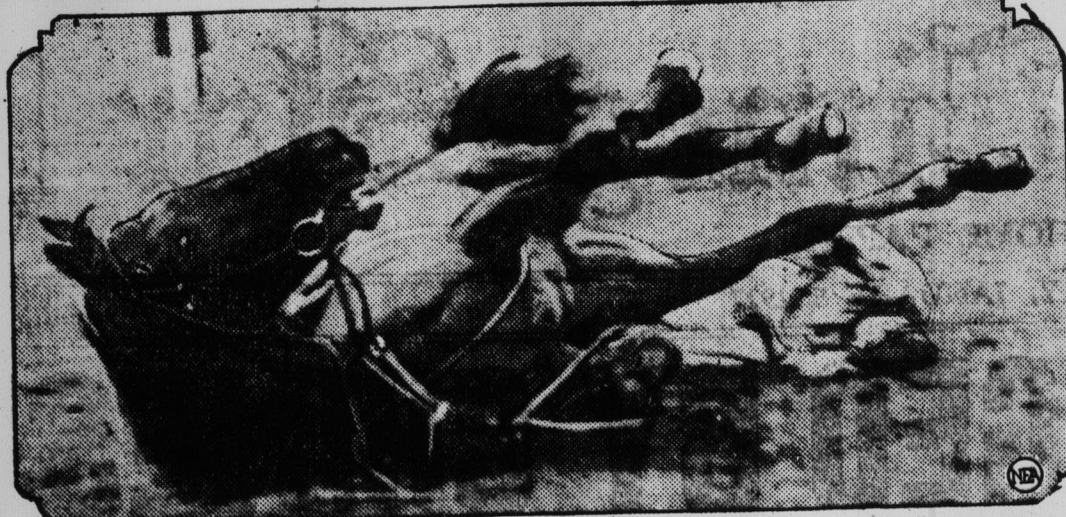

### No Idea of Making Any Counter-Treaty

LONDON, Jan. 5.—The Paris edition of the New York Herald has been publishing what it describes as sensational revelations concerning the supposed detente between the British Foreign Secretary, Sir Austen Chamberlain, and Premier Mussolini in the handling over of Albanian independence to Italy. The paper says that Sir Austen Chamberlain, after the signing of the Franco-German agreement at Thoiry decided to approach Italy with a view to making a counter-treaty. This idea, it was emphasized to British United Press today, is entirely opposed to Great Britain's policy and is utterly untrue.

### SOUNDS WARNING

Could Counsel Says People Becoming Suspicious

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 5.—A warning that the country is becoming "suspicious" of Senate investigation was contained in a brief filed with the Senate elections committee today by counsel for Senator Gould, Republican, Maine, under investigation on charges of bribing a New Brunswick Premier, to obtain a railway contract.

"The eyes of the people from every state in this great union have been focused upon the United States Senate," said the brief. "They have been watching investigation after investigation and have been taking into account the large amount of time expended in these investigations and the vast sums of the people's money expended in connection therewith and they have been putting into the other side of the scales, the net results of all these investigations and they have necessarily been convinced that the net result of that which it proposed to accomplish, has been practically nil.

### CANADIAN FIRM IS AWARDED CONTRACT

Will Build Capitol Building For The Cuban Government at Havana

A Canadian firm, Purdy & Henderson, of Montreal, has been awarded the contract for erection of a new capitol building at Havana, Cuba. The building will be similar to the Capitol at Washington, and the contractor's price was \$3,000,000. The sixth Pan-American Union meeting will be held at the new capitol in February, 1928, and an invitation will be extended to Canada to have representatives present.

The Cuban government has made an appropriation of a half million dollars to care for the entertainment and traveling expenses of the visiting delegates. Another important contract awarded was that for the construction of the Cuban Central Railroad from one end of the island to the other. The length of the road will be 750 miles. The contractor's price was \$78,000,000, the tender of Warren Brothers, New York, being accepted. Purdy & Henderson also tendered for this work.

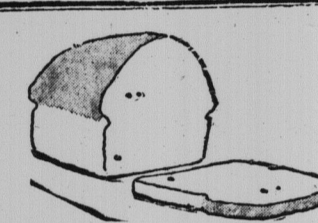
