

QUEER SHOPS ARE FOUND IN LONDON

Caviare is Sold in Bookshop—Spice Shop in Theatre-land.

London, Sept. 23.—In a street near the heart of London is a book-shop which sells caviare. London adventures might very well begin with a search for strange shops, for they are full of delightful surprises.

No one would suspect, from the appearance of the book-shop, that inside you might buy half a pound of delicious caviare for 8s. 6d., but the high shelves above the books hold little round jars where the most luxurious of all precludes to a meal is held in waiting for the gourmet.

The owner of the shop is a Siberian

Journalist. Many people must have passed its doors, uninterested in the Russian books in the window, who would be interested in the curious Russian sweets of the type that used to delight Russian girls long ago in the Russian cigarettes, and in the toys so gay that they would brighten the dullest nursery.

Exited Russians make the little shop their club, coming here to buy the latest Russian novels published in any land but Russia, to meet their friends, and to talk over old times. It is, perhaps, the only shop in London which is used as a club.

Another strange shop is the spice shop in Theatre-land. Who was Colonel Skinner? A very famous man, no doubt, for a chutney, "sliced, sweet, and hot," has been named after him, and bottles decorate the windows.

Here, also, you may buy halchaung, a condiment made of shrimps; guava cheese, tamarinds, stuffed mangoes, West India salamanquidy, mignonette pepper, snijoe, a farinaceous preparation, and boxes of opopodams, which are thin wafer biscuits eaten with curries.

Close to a well-known draper's shop is a shop which yesterday asked passers-by to look at "Today's bargain."

The bargain was not a hat or an article of food. It was a copy of the first edition of "Ties of the d'Urberville," in three volumes, at the price of 12s., and it stood, dusty and tired, tied up with string, on a shelf in a first edition bookshop.

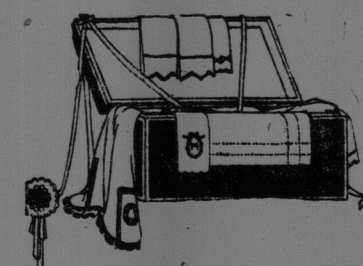
