BIG CONVENTION FOR TORONTO

American Association for the Advancement of Science to Bring 1,000 Visitors—Prominent Figures.

(Toronto Mail and Empire).

When one realizes that it is science that has given to the world its telephones, its motor cars, its poison gas, its bath tubs, its tooth brushes, its agriculture and all that goes to make modern life and war what they are, there is something of more than passing interest in the approaching assembly in Toronto of a thousand or more of the foremost scientists on the North American continent.

Coming to the city to attend the seventy-fourth annual meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, which opens in Convocation Hall and other buildings of the University of Toronto, on December 27th, those scientists will bring with them knowledge from the four corners of the continent of all that has passed in their respective spheres of activity during the past year. With the American Association are coming twenty-five affiliated societies which will hold their own particular programs.

Even to that average individual known as the man in the street, there is something impressive about the magnitude and complexity of such a gathering or such gatherings, even though he may regard them as having but little connection with his own practical affairs. But they are of more interest to him than he realizes. For instance, the Entomological Society of America is going to talk about insects.

Bugs have the habit of eating fruit and part of the entomologists' discussion will center around the means of preventing that consumption of fruit by the unauthorized consumer. One paper that has already been received tells of using airplanes to aid in the battle with the bugs, dusting fruit trees with poison from the air.

Forecasting the Weather Or, take the American Meteorological Society, composed of individuals who are the weather men of the continent. One of their members has suggested that the giving of such information as to what the weather will be for a year ahead.
