### MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

Henry B. Endicott of Boston, who was in charge of the United States relief work at Halifax explosion, left an estate valued at \$10,000,000. The estate goes to members of his family.

The shareholders of the Grand Trunk Railway at a meeting in London yesterday agreed to accept the offer of the Canadian government, but passed a resolution protesting against the unfairness

of the terms. Several speakers denounced the action of the government in the matter, one, a clergyman formerly of British Columbia, Rev. Leonard Dawson, saying the British shareholders had been dealing with a Canadian government which "had no morals."

Ottawa will now appoint a board of arbitration to determine the figures, and a board of operation for the G. T. R. and G. T. P. until these are absorbed in the national system.

Civil actions are said to be pending in Ottawa against ninety returned soldiers on charges of swindling the patriotic fund.

The national conference of educationists in session in Ottawa yesterday heard a discussion on the teaching of French and English in the schools of the dominion, but no resolution was offered in the matter. E. J. Bulman was elected without opposition as president of the National Council of Education. Members of the council include Rev. J. J. Tompkins, Antigonish; F. P. Peacock, Fredericton, and L. W. Simms and G. F. Smith, of St. John.
