Washington, Aug. 18—An appropriation of \$900,000 as an additional contribution to the American committee for Armenian and Syrian relief was announced today by the American Red Cross war council. The fund will be given in three installments of \$800,000 each to cover the months of August, September and October.

Intense suffering among the civilian population of Armenia, Syria, Persia, the Caucasus, Mesopotamia, Palestine, and other countries in the Near East still is reported and recently the Armenian and

other countries in the Near East still is reported and recently the Armenian and Syrian relief committee asked for additional aid from the Red Cross. People were reported dying in the streets from starvation and that typhus and cholera were spreading rapidly.
