Another Misleading Statement Denied

Hon. J. E. Michaud Tells Facts Concerning Hydro Supply to Edmundston.

Hon. J. E. Michaud, minister without portfolio in the Provincial Government, yesterday gave the lie direct to a report featured on the front page of a St. John morning paper with reference to hydro power at Edmundston. The report said that owing to a shortage of water in the St. John and Madawaska rivers the hydro plant at Edmundston was failing to supply the demand for street lighting and manufacturing purposes and that no power was available in the day time and only a limited amount at night. The town it was said, obtained its power from Three Rivers, P. Q.

Hon. Mr. Michaud felt, he said, that such misleading reports might have an adverse influence on public opinion regarding hydro development. The truth of the matter was, he said, that the water in the St. John and Madawaska rivers had nothing to do with the case as the power came from Green River, ten miles from the town. Furthermore it did not get its power from Three Rivers, 250 miles away. There was a shortage of power owing to the fact that the hydro plant had been built to serve 1,000 people and the population had increased to more than 4,000. For that reason the people were asking for the development of Grand Falls power. He said the correspondent of the paper in which the report was published denied making any statement regarding low water in the St. John or Madawaska rivers and also denied making any mention of Edmundston being supplied with power from Three Rivers, P. Q.

Shanley's Is Bankrupt And Closes Doors

New York, March 29. — Shanley's lights have gone out.

Shanley's was one of the first of the White Light restaurants. It is one of the first to go.

It has followed the way of Churchills, the Knickerbocker, Healy's and other Broadway "institutions" that won friends and devotees from all lands and formed one of the chief features of the Broadway-theatre.

"A big restaurant in Broadway can't make money now," John J. Moran, the manager, said.

Thomas J. Shanley, as president of Shanley Company, has filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy.

Decision to close the restaurant permanently came close on the heels of an action brought by United States Attorney Haywood to close it for a year under the "badlock" section of the Volstead act. Allegation was made in this action that the restaurant persisted in serving some of the old-time cheer.

Liabilities were placed at \$196,686, and assets at \$29,278.

Ruhr Seizure Promotes U. S. Coal Exports

Shortage of Fuel Abroad is Reflected in Greater Demand From States—British Mines Restricted.

New York, March 29.—The occupation of the Ruhr coal field by the French, with consequent decrease in its coal production, entailing as it does shutting off of supplies to Italy, France, Germany and other European countries, has caused some increase in United States exports of bituminous coal, according to a statement from the Department of Commerce.

British colliery owners and coal merchants seem to be unable to supply the increased demand for coal and coke resulting from the Ruhr situation, as not only has their production of coal reached its probable maximum under existing conditions, but their dock capacity, which is and has been for some time the governing factor in their export trade, is heavily over-taxed. This is due largely to the fact that British dock labor has insisted upon only two eight-hour shifts a day. Strong efforts have been made to put on an additional shift, but so far with little success, and the whole matter has now been referred to the Industrial Court, which means a probable delay of six months before the matter can be adjusted.

Information received from the commercial attaché of the Department of Commerce at London, dated February 15, speaking of the Scotch coal situation, was to the effect that on that date there were ninety-four vessels waiting at the chief Scotch ports, seventy of them on the east coast.

British coal exports for January were 5,511,670 gross tons, as compared with 5,070,318 tons in January, 1918, 3,794,770 tons in January, 1914, and 4,020,935 tons in January, 1922.

British production is now ranging from about 5,667,000 to 5,664,000 tons a week, compared with an average of 5,520,000 tons in 1918, the previous year of greatest production. The total production for 1922 was 238,839,000 gross tons, as compared with 286,729,000 tons in 1918.

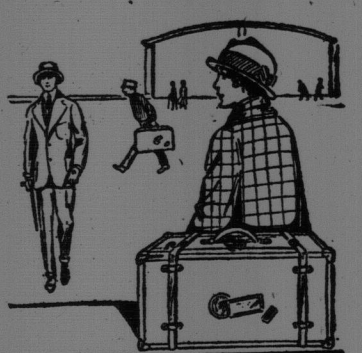
