Ottawa, April 18.—In the House of Commons yesterday a motion to abolish the "mountain scale" of freight rates in British Columbia as unjustly discriminatory against that province was moved by General J. London, April 5.—(By Mail)—The tendency for wholesale prices in this country to rise began in October last, and possibly the most noticeable feature of the past month has been the acceleration of this movement.
