TORONTO, WEDNESDAY,

The Synod met, and was constituted by the Rev. Mr. Barrie, Moderator.

A question was raised as to the correctness of the minutes in regard to the omission of the protest of Mr. Jennings and the Session of Toronto congregation, against the resolution of Synod to refer their case to a committee.

It was moved by Dr. Wm. Taylor, and seconded by Mr. Hogg, That Mr. Jennings be allowed to enter his protest, as demanded by him.

Deliberance on.

It was moved, in amendment, by Mr. Thornton, and seconded by Mr. Drummond,

That the protest taken at this stage be not received, on the ground of informality, and inasmuch as his Protest has been fully allowed at a subsequent stage of the business; and that the minutes as they stand be therefore sustained.

The amendment being first put, was carried; and the Synod did and do decide in terms thereof.

Dissent and
Protest.

Mr. Jennings, in his own name, and in the name and in behalf of the Session, dissented and protested, for reasons to be given in.

It was agreed to enter upon the case.
