Blow So Injures That He Can Only See

When Lying Down

NEW YORK, July 30.—On a cot in the Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital, under the particular care of Dr. Frank Van Fleet, of No. 60 West Seventy-seventh street, a specialist in the treatment of diseases of the eye, is a patient suffering from an extraordinary form of blindness.

He is a young man, and in all other respects is not only healthy and vigorous, but a trained athlete. While he is standing or sitting in an upright position he is almost totally blind, but while lying recumbent he sees objects distinctly and with his normal visual powers. That has been his strange condition for about six months, and during that period he has remained most of the time in a resumbent position.
