BLACK'S TEAM WON BALKE TOURNAMENT

The Balke Colander bowling tournament finished last night and the Black's Bowling Company team proved victorious, having won the five games they rolled. The Victoria team was second with four games won, and one lost. Halifax with Joe Fitzgerald, a former St. John boy, was third. Black's alleys were crowded with enthusiastic fans last night to witness the final struggle between Blacks and Victorias. The team had won four games each and the championship rested on the last game.

The game commenced at ten o'clock and when the first string finished it looked as if the Victorias would win the match for in this string they had 32 of a lead. Blacks finished strong however, and won the next two strings with lead enough to win out on the total. Vince Kelley, of the Vics, rolled 129 in the first string and captured the prize for the highest individual score in the tournament. Ed. Moore, of Blacks, won the second prize with a score of 119 and also won the prize for highest average, making 88.45.

When the championship silver trophy was first put up for competition it was won by the St. Croix, of Calais, Me. Black's team went to Calais afterwards and won it. The Victorias were the next winners, and then Blacks again captured it and have held it ever since, last night's victory being the seventh since the trophy has been in competition. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead, but must be at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house.
