## MARKET MAKES SHARP RECOVERY

Stock Traders Taking More Kindly to Harding's Nomination.

(F. B. McCURDY & CO.)  
New York, June 15.—Traders were allowed to sell stocks through first half hour, but then substantial orders appeared and there was a sharp recovery. Barrett and Antline led the advance, the former being up 1 1/2 at 129, and Antline up nearly four at 71 1/2. Mergers involving these two concerns are understood to be progressing favorably.  
It is said Barrett will go into combination at a figure well above \$100 a share, and National Antline preferred is now at \$110. Wall Street bankers who know Harding, say that within next two months the public will come to a realization that he is the right man for President's chair. He is level headed, the type of man who will appeal to intelligent working classes, the farmer and general public. He is a good campaigner, has a good personality and yellow journals will depict in their efforts to find material for mud tactics. His life has been clean and he has been constructive in all his efforts. One banker says Harding is a whirlwind at campaigning and his popularity will increase 100 per cent. after his first public speech.

## GOLD OUTPUT IN ONTARIO

Toronto, June 15.—Official figures, which show an increase of 46 per cent. in the gold output of Ontario for the first quarter of 1920, as compared with the first quarter of 1919, offers a good idea of the important proceedings being made at the gold mines of the province, notably at Porcupine and Kirkland Lake. That such an achievement should be recorded under stress of economic conditions which prevail seems to augur well for the gold mining industry, especially when the cost of material becomes adjusted. In regard to both gold and silver mining industry of Northern Ontario, there appears to be ample reason for optimism.

## ATLANTIC SUGAR IN DIVIDEND

Montreal, June 15.—The official announcement is made of a declaration by the directors of Atlantic Sugar of 1 3/4 per cent. on the preferred stock and an additional dividend of 1 3/4 per cent. applicable to arrears, payable July 2nd to shareholders of record June 21st.  
With the declaration of this additional dividend on the preferred, the company is continuing the policy of paying out the arrears since the first of the year. On July 1st, 1919, the company owed to preferred shareholders dividends to the amount of 45 per cent., so that deducting these three extra dividends, the dividends in arrears on the preferred stock of Atlantic Sugar now amounts to 29 3/4 per cent.

## THE TITLES OF STAFF OFFICERS

Under the reconstruction of the permanent force, the titles of the staff officers in the various military districts throughout Canada have been slightly changed, with a view, it is understood, to adopt the titles used during the war. Under this system Lieut-Colonel A. H. H. Powell, assistant adjutant-general, is now assistant adjutant and quartermaster-general of this district.  
Several other appointments appear in routine orders as follows:—Acting Lieut-Colonel A. G. Lawson has been appointed captain and brevet major in the reconstituted Royal Canadian engineers; Lieut. E. M. Burns has been promoted to the rank of captain; Captain J. A. McCarthy, superintendent of the D. S. C. R. hospital at Lancaster, has been appointed a captain in the Royal Canadian regiment army medical corps; Captain and Brevet Major M. J. A. Amundson to be a major in the pay corps.  
The following order has also been received with respect to the wearing of medals:—"Regarding the foreign commemorative war medals, all interchange of such medals have been abolished and permission to wear these cannot be granted. Permission may be granted only to those whose names have appeared in the London Gazette and having been awarded distinctions in respect of which the Gazette office gave permission to wear."  
The following officers have been appointed to the reserve of officers:—Major P. B. Young, Major Malcolm Mackay, Lieut. Orin Alonso Reid, Lieut. George H. Vanverbeke, and Lieut. J. M. Lamb.

## FLOUR AND FEED MARKETS DULL

Very Little Demand Except for the Lower Grades of Flour.

Minneapolis, Minn., June 15.—The Northwestern Miller's weekly review of the flour trade says the flour and feed markets are uniformly dull with little demand, except for the lower grades of flour, and mills generally are not pressing sales, feed prices are slowly falling, but are still only about a dollar and a half per ton lower than the record high point four weeks ago.  
Flour prices dropped sharply the first part of last week but recovered later, and are now only about twenty-five cents per barrel lower than on June 15th. Opinion is sharply divided as to what wheat and flour prices will do next month after the new crop begins to arrive. The output continues fair for this season, which is normally by slack. The Kansas, Oklahoma hard winter wheat mills reporting last week an output thirty-three per cent of capacity, the Ohio Valley soft winter wheat mills forty-four per cent and the spring wheat mills, forty-five per cent.

## FIRE DESTROYS VALUABLE MILL

The Modern Lumber Mill of James Robinson, Situated at Newcastle, a Mass. of Ruins.

Newcastle, June 15.—A mass of twisted iron and smouldering ruins is all that remains today of one of the best saw mills on the North Shore. The mill of James Robinson, built last year at a cost of about one hundred thousand dollars and employing one hundred hands, was totally destroyed by fire which broke out before four o'clock. The cause of the fire is unknown, but when discovered by the watchman, the whole interior of the mill was a mass of flames, and before an alarm could be sounded the intense heat, some of the flames confined to the mill, and a few piles of lumber on the main lumber yard reached it reaching the main lumber yard where several million feet of cut lumber was piled. The Morrissey bridge was also saved from destruction after it had been ablaze time and time again. Practically every fireman suffered from burns, due to the intense heat, some quite severely.

## BRAZILIAN MOVE IS DISAPPOINTING

No Immediate Declaration of Dividends to Shareholders of Common Stock.

Montreal, June 15.—The local street seems not to be looking forward to an immediate declaration of dividend to the shareholders of common stock of Brazilian trefol, and the statement made yesterday, that the directors would not take any action at this time was accepted as representing the situation. The stock seemed generally around 44.  
While there will naturally be disappointment over any further delay in the matter of dividends, it is recalled that announcements emanating from London recently were quite confusing, and, in any event, did not go to support the theory that a dividend would be declared at this time. Furthermore, the possibility of additional financing was mentioned. Details concerning the latter were entirely lacking, but in some quarters, it was thought possible that such financing, if any, might be contingent upon payment of dividends. Upon such a theory, the failure to pay dividends might have its compensation in the long run.  
Another feature from which shareholders may draw a certain amount of consolation is contained in a statement heard to the effect that, when the dividend does come, it may start at the rate of 5 per cent instead of 4 per cent rate which was expected. It is added that this 5 per cent declaration may be made six months hence.

## HIGHER MARKET FOR PAPER STOCKS

Montreal, June 15.—The market was quiet and uninteresting during the greater part of the morning session, prices in the majority of cases showing recessions from yesterday's levels. Towards the close of the morning session Brompton rallied sharply, and, during the recess there was an accumulation of buying orders which resulted in a brisk and active demand for all the Paper securities. Advances of from two to four points were recorded, and the best prices of the day were made right at the close. It looks as though some special inducement will be needed to get the speculative public away from the Paper stocks, and present indications point to an active and higher market for these securities.

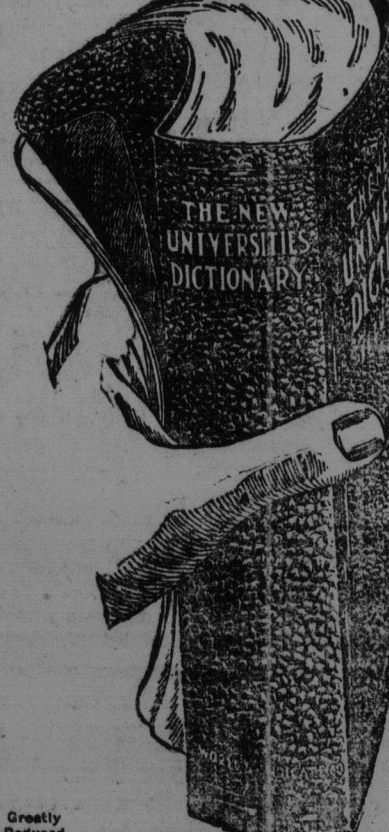
