

Canadian, British and Foreign.

The storm which has been raging in the Bay of Biscay for several days continues unabated. Many boats and over seventy persons are missing from that gulf. No foreign mails have been received there for eight days.

There was a heavy fall of snow in the northern section of France yesterday. In Jagers, Department of Meuse at Loire, the roof of the market was unable to sustain the weight of snow and gave way, causing death and injuring many persons.

Two thousand more troops are to be sent to China. New strikes are threatened among the iron miners of England.

It is reported that Harbord regards the action of Reichstag yesterday as equivalent to a vote of want of confidence and is determined to resign.

It is thought that yesterday's bill will be modified.

New York, Dec. 17. Gold fell a little. Exchange 86 1/2 a 3/4. French Canadian in Boston in connection with the death sentence imposed on Legation, and voted to send the Governor General of Canada a petition with over 200 signatures that Legation be immediately released, and that the general amnesty promised by Sir John A. Macdonald's Government be granted to all Manitoba rebels.

LONDON, Dec. 17. Ewing DINKER REMARKS had an interview with the Emperor today. Rumors of his resignation are still repeated, but in the same parliamentary circles it is reported that the difficulty has been completely settled.

The Ontario Assembly will probably prorogue on Saturday. It is ascertained that Dallas, manager of Molson's Bank, Toronto, has absconded with \$40,000, as they were all in one thousand Dominion notes.

Champagne, a dissolute young fellow, has been arrested in Montreal on a charge of murdering Mr. Farrell, a respectable farmer of that section, on the 19th Nov. last. The ruffian had twice robbed his victim. He is lodged in Montreal Jail.

A despatch from Sarina says, news has been received that a squaw had been shot on the reserve on Tuesday morning. Five men from that township are suspected, and four have been arrested on suspicion.

The North Victoria election took place on the 16th. James McLennan, Toronto, was nominated as Government candidate and H. Cameron, Toronto, Opposition.
