Tait's Corners Red Cross Society will hold a meeting in the school house on Saturday afternoon, November 9th, at 2 o'clock for the purpose of packing boxes for the soldiers overseas. All members are requested to be present and bring their donations.

W. J. Mawhinney of London, formerly of Ekfrid, who has been in ill health for some time, took a serious turn while on a visit at his father-in-law's at Alvington a couple of weeks ago and is now in Victoria Hospital. A surgical operation was performed yesterday and his condition is more hopeful.

Corporal D. C. McArthur, who has been with the Canadian forces since 1915, was officially reported gassed on October 11. His father received a cable from Dan himself saying that he was better and back on duty again on October 22. Corporal McArthur has been in action in France for nearly two years.

Last Thursday Rev. and Mrs. Irwin were called away by telegram to Battle Creek owing to the death from pneumonia of J. R. Todd, brother of Mrs. Irwin. Mr. Irwin wishes to say that while he will call in any home that desires him to call, he thinks it better not to call only as necessary as he has come in contact with the epidemic.

The tax collector will be making his annual visit to the ratepayers during the next few weeks, flu or no flu, and it will be well to be prepared to meet him with the cash, as the banks this year will not receive payments on this account. Glencoe and adjoining municipalities will levy an extra assessment on taxes not paid by the end of the year.

There is said to be good ground for hope that the influenza epidemic will soon have spent itself. Conditions in the cities show considerable improvement during the last few days. Locally the malady has not been of a very serious nature, although in the country districts the cases have been more numerous, doctors say in all probability due to gatherings such as threshing bees.

The churches of Canada are being asked by the Minister of Finance to call special attention in their services to the Victory Loan, and appeal is made to the clergy to make Sunday, November 3rd, a recognized Victory Loan Sunday throughout Canada, with a service specially devoted to the need, and on the following Sunday, November 10th, the last of the campaign to invite the laymen prominently identified with the canvass to deliver a short address in every pulpit where it can be made possible.
