Town Council.

A special meeting of the Council was held on Wednesday evening with Mayor Black and Couns. Hales, McKenna, Selfridge, Abbott and Ford present. The Mayor stated the object of the meeting to be the consideration of the electric light question and the advisability of advertising for the sale of \$25000 of town debentures, as well as any other business that may come before the Council.

Coun. Selfridge reported briefly for the Police Committee and Coun. Hales for the Finance Committee. The former referred to the disorderly conduct on the streets last Saturday night and stated that proceedings had been set in motion to punish the offenders.

Letters were read from Rev. W. V. Higgins, asking for terms for use of water for small motor, and from Capt. Rodman Pratt, asking to be allowed tree water for fountain in consideration of his providing a free watering place for horses, &c. The Council disallowed the latter request, and referred the first-named application to the Water Committee.

The following accounts were read and ordered to be paid:— T. L. Harvey \$1.80, Wolfville Decorating Co. .42, E. M. Archibald .18, 20. Contingent account .25.

O. D. Harris, 1.50. The Mayor reported that necessary land at Black River had been bonded by the town for the term of one year. The Clerk was instructed to have advertisements inserted in the local newspaper and one or more Halifax papers, offering for sale four per cent. electric light and power debentures to the amount of twenty thousand dollars.
