MACK, WILLIAM, J.P. (Cornwall.)

B. in Lanarkshire, Scot., in 1828. Ed. in Huntington, P.Q. M. at Cornwall, Ont., 3 March 1855, to Agnes Henderson, dau. of the late Wm. Henderson, of Cornwall Township, a native of Scot. Was a mem. of Town Council of Cornwall from 1867 to 1878, with the exception of two years. Warden of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry for 1878. First returned to Parlt. by acclamation at last g.e. A Liberal.—Cornwall, Ont.

MADILL, FRANK, M.A. (North Ontario.)

Youngest s. of Henry and Eliza Madill, who came to Canada from Monahan, Irel, in 1837. B. in the Township of Scott, Co. of Ontario, 23 Nov. 1852, and ed. at the Univ. of Toronto, where he graduated B.A. in 1873 and M.A. in 1876. Is unmarried. Called to the Bar, Ont., Michaelmas Term, 1877. First returned to Parlt. 4 June 1881, on the appointment of the sitting mem. Mr. Thomas Paxton, to the Shrievalty, of the Co. of Ontario. A Liberal Conservative and opposed to present Govt. Favors the reduction of the number of members in the Leg. to one-half, and is opposed to the centralization of
