SIR,—I have the honour to submit the Public Accounts of the Dominion of Canada, for the fiscal year ended 30th June, 1887, together with the several statements of all previous years since Confederation. These statements for convenience have been arranged in a slightly different order from that of last year, and a new statement showing the expenditure under the various parliamentary appropriations has been added, and as was agreed upon during the last session there is included as part of the volume a statement showing the liabilities on account of the different railway subsidies granted by Parliament.

Compared with recent financial years the records of the year just closed show that nothing of special notice has happened. A few small loans issued before Confederation have matured and no loans have been placed on the market.
