

Sub Has Lots To Offer Students

Ever wonder where you can borrow a typewriter (FREE)? Buy a postage stamp? Buy a Fredericton Transit Bus Pass? Or buy a photocopy?

Well, many students at UNB seem to be unaware that these services are available to them right in the SUB.

These services are provided by the UNB Student Union and are but one of the many ways membership in your Student Union works for you the students of UNB.

The following is a list of the many services provided:

Typewriters

We have 8 typewriters available for your use. You must provide your own paper but we supply ribbons and corrector tapes for the machines. They must be used in Room 118 and cannot be taken from the room. They are available each day from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. Glenna will be there from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. After hours, you can get to the SUB Office and the officer on duty will let you in to Room 118. You must leave your UNB student I.D. Card at the SUB Office while in the room. Typewriters are also available on week-ends through SUB Office. You may book a machine in advance by calling 453-4955 and asking for the Help Centre. Sorry - food, drink and children are not allowed in the room. There are

too many dangers of accidents with all of the electrical equipment.

Photocopies

We have two photocopy machines which are available for use by students and also by faculty clubs and societies. The way they operate is by getting the counter key from Glenna; it counts the copies and when you return it to her, you then pay ten cents per copy. If you do not know how to use the machine - PLEASE ASK! Glenna will be happy to explain it to you. She is also an expert at making cheat-sheets. Photocopies are only available between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. (except for a half hour for lunch 12:00 - 12:30).

Bus Passes

Fredericton Transit Rider Cards are a very economical investment for students who regularly travel on the bus. By using a Rider Card you only pay sixty-two and half cents per ride. Students can purchase a 24 ride card for \$15.00 or a 12 ride card for \$7.50. Non-student cards and bus schedules are also available here.

Postage Stamps

We usually keep on hand a supply of thirty-eight cent

stamps just as an added little convenience to the students and will sell you up to ten at a time. If you need to purchase a large number of stamps or odd denominations, then you can get them at the Post Office in the basement of the Old Arts Building.

New UNB Student ID Cards

If you have lost your UNB I.D. Card or had it stolen, you can get a replacement card. The cost for a new card is \$5.00 and you must pick up the initial form at the Help Centre. This form is required by the Registrar's Office for them to issue you a new computer card which is in turn required by Graphic Services in order to issue you a new I.D. card. Graphic Services will only make these cards on Mondays and Fridays.

International Student ID Cards

ISIC Cards are also sold at the Help Centre. All you need is a small passport-type photo, a letter from the Registrar's Office stating that you are in FULL-TIME attendance at a school or university and \$7.50. This is a must if you plan to travel overseas.

Tickets to Up-Coming Events

We usually sell tickets to many of the up-coming events on campus or we can usually tell you where tickets are on sale.

T-Shirts, Shorts, Scarves

We sell Grad Class T-shirts, shorts for several different groups. Come and see them!! Examples:
