the management of the national railway so called under the Act, was

really in the hands of two of the old directors of the Camadian Northern.

This is not to cost a shadow of doubt upon the integrety of those two gentlemen. It is the principle that I am contending for, and my

contention is that, under such circumstances, it is impossible to say that political patronage has been eliminated through a sound method of

independent management.

Since then, it was discovered that the Board of Directors is composed of gentlemen largely interested in finance and business. Let me give first, the full personnel of the Board:-
