The Chief and Agent for the Golden Lake Reserve at the Department
to-day and state that the Indians there are on the verge of starvation
owing to present unusual conditions. They state that some of their
Indians have deer meat in the bush some distance from the Reserve and
are afraid to bring it out owing to attitude of your Game Warden. In
accordance with your letter of twelfth September our Agent was advised
that the game laws would be enforced with leniency where such a course
would alleviate suffering from hunger. Will you kindly instruct your
Game Warden at once to allow Indians to bring out meat already in the
bush and allow them to fish and hunt for their immediate necessities
for remainder of season. *Please reply*
