FIRST WITNESS FOR THE DEFENCE

The Accused, D.128243 Cunner Joseph Faul Emile AUBIN, No. 3A District Depot, C.A., being duly sworn, is examined by the Defending Officer:

- Onr Aubin, we will discuss the first charge, that is absenting yourself without leave. You understand that? 0.13
- Yes, Sir. A.13
- Tell your story to the Court? 0.14
- I was under doctor's care because I had hand eczema.

 They kept on sending me on duty washing dishes, pots and pans against the doctor's orders and the doctor told me not to do that kind of work, but the authorities sent me to do the work just the same so I got fed up with it and took it upon myself to go away and have the proper care by civilian doctors. A.14
- Did you show your hands to the medical officer this morning? 0.15
- I forgot about it this morning. A.15

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR

- Onr Aubin, did you go to the Army Medical Officer in regard to the condition of your hands? 0.16
- Yes. Sir. A.16
- And did he say you weren't in condition to do the work that you were doing? 0.17
- No, the doctor didn't tell me that, but he bandaged my A.17 hands.
- When you were taken in charge by the authorities, did you give yourself up or were you apprehended or arrested? 0.18
- My intention was to return to the Army, but one night wanted to have a place to sleep and I went to the police station andasked for a place to sleep and they asked me where I was from and all that and then took me into A.18 custody.
- Did you know the Army regulations in regard to staying away without proper authority? 0.19
- I thought I would have minor punishment for absenting A.19 myself.

The Defending Officer declines to re-examine.

In the opinion of the Court it is not necessary to comply with R.P.83(B).

The witness resumes his seat.

The Prosecutor makes a Closing Address.
