I cannot end these letters, Mr. Editor, without telling you what a privilege I found it to meet my brethren of the Antipodes. Your correspondent received a most cordial welcome from all—not least, in the absence of the Archbishop, from the Vicar-General. A courtly gentleman of the old school, he invited me to his house and to his pulpit. When I went to say good-bye he gave me a volume of his poems—and (I wonder, Mr. Editor, if the good custom is as frequent as it used to be) then knelt in prayer for me.
