THERE ARE HUNDREDS, and in some cases THOUSANDS, OF ARTICLES and CONTRIBUTIONS in the above valuable lot relating to angling, athletic sports, canine subjects, cards, chess, cricket, farming, football, the garden, golf, hunting, lawn tennis, natural history, pastimes, including archery, bicycling and tricycling, billiards, canoeing, falconry, hockey, lacrosse, polo, rackets, skating, swimming, tennis, poultry, rowing, shooting, travel and colonization, the turf, yatching.
