The Order of the day being read.

On motion made and seconded,---*Ordered*, That upon the question of paying the Members of the Assembly, after the names of the Members upon a division, the County such Member represents be added in the Journals.

Order for printing the Journals and Laws.

Committee appointed.

*Ordered*,---That two hundred copies of the Acts passed in the present Session, and of the Journals of the Votes and proceedings of this House be published, and that the *Attorney-General* and Mr. *Chipman* be a Committee to contract for and superintend the printing of the same.

Message from the Council.

A message from the Council informing the House that they had concurred in passing the following bills,---viz.

“ A bill in addition to an act, intituled, an act for regulating Pilots.”

“ A bill to amend an act, intituled, an act for regulating the exportation of fish and lumber, and for ascertaining the quality of the same.”

“ A bill to empower the Justices of the Sessions in several Counties in this province, to make such regulations respecting markets and ferries within such Counties, as may be found necessary.”

“ A bill in addition to an act, intituled, an act for the better extinguishing fires that may happen within the city of *Saint John*.”

“ A bill to provide for the support of a Light-House to be built upon *Partridge-Island*.

“ A bill to continue sundry acts of the General Assembly which are near expiring.”

And, “ a bill for appropriating and disposing of the public monies.”

Message from the Council.

A message from the Council, informing the House that they had concurred in passing “ a bill for regulating the fisheries in the different rivers, coves and creeks of this province.”

The House adjourned until twelve o'clock to-morrow.
