

CAP. III.

AN ACT to continue for a limited period Three several Acts therein mentioned.

[*March 1st, 1839.*]

WHEREAS the several Acts, the Titles of which are hereinafter recited, are about to expire, and it is expedient that the same should be continued for a limited period: Be it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *William the Fourth*, intituled *An Act to make and keep in repair the Pumps and Wells of Charlottetown, and for other purposes, and to repeal a certain Act therein mentioned*; and an Act passed in the same Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, intituled *An Act to regulate the weight and quality of Bread within the Town and Royalty of Charlottetown*, and continued for One Year by an Act for that purpose passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty; and also an Act passed in the Eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *George the Fourth*, intituled *An Act to authorize the formation of a Fire Engine Company for the Town of Charlottetown*, and continued for Five Years by an Act for that purpose passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *William the Fourth*, and every clause, matter and thing therein respectively contained, be continued and remain in force for Six Years from the passing hereof, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the General Assembly, and no longer.

Continues Act of 3 Will. 4, to make and keep in repair the Pumps and Wells of Charlottetown,

and Act of the same Year of the same King, regulating the Weight and quality of Bread in Charlottetown:

and also Act of 8 Geo. 4, authorizing the formation of a Fire Engine Company in Charlottetown, for Six years, and to the end of the then next Session of the General Assembly.
