On that occasion, according to a report by the committee of management of the fund, dated July 22, 1815, the subscriptions and accu years to £534,450 18s 11d. Out this sum gratuities and relief were distributed in all to 18,000 individuals, including widows, children, and relatives of persons killed and wounded and disabled seamen and soldiers.
