**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS**  
The sole head of a family, or any man over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.  
Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required where residence is performed in the vicinity.  
Five-acre lots may be subdivided for cultivation under certain conditions.  
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$300 per acre.  
Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent also 60 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead text on certain conditions.  
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre.  
Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years. Pre-empt 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

## News Notes

The \$145,000,000 estate of L. W. Harkness, holder of Standard Oil securities, will have to pay a New York State tax of six and a half million dollars.

The new wireless station at Cholila Heights, near San Diego, California, recently completed at a cost of \$300,000 will be able to communicate with stations 12,000 miles distant. Conversations have already been held with Australian stations.

Two brothers who left England twelve years ago, one for Canada and the other for Australia, met each other unexpectedly the other day on the steps of the Union Jack Club, Waterloo road.

Two children belonging to an Italian who fled from Roumania by way of Russia have died in England. The youngest, aged two years, died in the mother's arms at Charing Cross Hospital.

Mr. Justice Bray, at the Somerset Assizes, commented on the reduction of criminal cases, and said the people seemed to have the idea that they ought to behave themselves during the war.

Two women were suffocated in a New York rooming house fire and one man was killed by leaping.

Rear-Admiral Chadwick in an address given in New York claimed that the American women were letting the race die.

A Chicago woman was followed to her apartments by two men, who cut off her hair, for which she had been offered \$150.

Four hundred and seventy-three wild ducks were seized on the Long Island estate of H. C. Phipps by game wardens. Charges have been laid of illegal trapping. If Phipps is found guilty he may be fined \$15,315.
