THE ROAD TO SUCCESS

A striking and worthy example of up-to-date philosophy, followed up by timely common sense advice, appeared in yesterday's edition of the Chicago American in a thoughtful, well-written article on "the demon of unrest." The illustration pictured a young man being impelled in a difficult, rocky ascent. A demon was standing on his back, vigorously urging him on with a whip in his strenuous journey upward. The application gave the rocky ascent as the way of life, with the young man anxious to reach the top, his efforts being the result of the lashings of the whip in the hands of the demon, which represented unrest, discontent, or ambition.

It was a forceful way in which to put a common truth, and there was a world of meaning in the accompanying comments. Whenever you are dissatisfied with what you do, whenever you plan better deeds for the future the invisible, unconquerable, all-absorbing passion of unrest, discontent or ambition is lashing your sides. When you cease to feel his blows your days of growth and upward climbing are about done. Every man who is dissatisfied with himself, or things as they are, will accomplish something if he has the right kind of discontent—the kind which instills ambition to succeed. Man came out of a mystery into a few years of conscious life, and he will be going out of this life soon enough. He should use the few years at his disposal, grow all he can, change all he can, and achieve all he can. Mental restlessness should be encouraged. Contentment means stagnation, and stagnation is death.

This is pretty good talk. It is advice which means nothing but success to the young man who hears it. As Crown Attorney Herb Smith said to the young people of First Church a few nights ago, the world is looking for the young man who can do things—the young man who is not satisfied to stop to pride himself upon present success, but who is continually striving towards something better. This is the young man who is fortunate enough to have an energetic and tireless demon of discontent and ambition continually lashing his back, torturing him, it is true, but making him accomplish something—making him do his duty by doing his best.

This advice is not alone for any particular young man, but may be very aptly applied to men and wo-

men as a community. Every person who resides in any community owes a public as well as a personal duty. One is just as important as the other. The demon of unrest and progressiveness should lash your sides as vigorously in public matters as in private.

People in Chatham might possibly have better excuse than many others for stopping to pride themselves upon the beauty and successful record of their city. This is when stagnation starts. As soon as people begin to be satisfied with their surroundings as they are, it is time to call for more demons. Set them to work and encourage them to hit harder.

Evidence of the work of this little demon have come into prominence in this city within the last few months. A number of public-spirited citizens felt his lashings and became discontent with Chatham as she was. They felt that the Maple City should go ahead at a faster pace and they have started out to do their share. The demon has greatly added to his numbers since that time. The infection of unrest spread fast until the city has been awakened and enlivened by men who are doing something for Chatham.

Evidence of the success which follows discontent is shown by the fact that in a few days a by-law will be submitted to the people which, if it passes, will mean that the demon of unrest has urged this city to a higher plane of prominence, for coupling to this progressive eagerness, concentrated action, Chatham and its citizens will soon be placed in the foremost rank of prosperous industry. It means that every person living here has moved up with the city. Other men are doing their share. Do yours. If you cannot do a big thing, do a small one, but do something. Respond to the whip of dissatisfaction and progressiveness by supporting a measure which will benefit you and encourage your demon of ambition to remain with you, goading you on, ever upward, along the rocky ascent towards the goal of usefulness and success.
