## MORE WELLS ARE STRUCK

Oil Is Being Secured In Tilbury In Great Paying Quantities

### SEVEN WELLS FINISHED

The Tilbury East Oil Company made another big strike on the J. W. Smith farm near Stewart on Saturday at noon. This is the second oil producing well which has been put down in this part and it is claimed that well No. 2 is even better than well No. 1. The first well is now producing 50 barrels of oil per day.

On Saturday evening a second producing well was also struck on the Marshall property. It is said to be one of the best wells in the field.

There are now seven completed wells in the Tilbury field all producing oil in paying quantities. It is estimated that fifteen more wells will be put down within the next three weeks.

It is said that there is enough gas escaping from any one of the seven completed wells to supply all the needs of the whole city of Chatham.
