Cathedral, Toronto, tells an interesting story about Phillips Brooks.
The story relates to a Church Congress in Boston in 1877, when Dr.
Rainsford was down on the program

"I went to the Music Hall about "I went to the Music Hall about 8," says Dr. Rainsford, "and saw an audience of quite 2,000 people, the place jammed and 250 clergymen and hishops on the platform. Cold shudders ran down my back. However, I knew my subject or thought I did, and I was going to speak without notes, something I have never done since. My turn came after Father Benson of Oxford. The whole place looked black to me. I got up, stammered and sputtered for five or six minutes—my time was twenty-five minutes—and sat down. I am not exaggerating in this. I did not say one clear sentence that would parse in that time. I sat down in darkness, and the meeting went on. At last people began to go; then men began to leave the platform. I did not know a soul. I sat there utterly cast down, a lonely youth indeed. All at once a large hand was laid on my shoulder, and a big, kind voice said. Mr. Rainsford, will you preach for me in Trinity Church next Sunday morning? That was my first meeting with Phillips Brooks. Was it any wonder I loved him?"
