Some Pickle Receipts.

PICKLED PEAS.—Seven pounds of dried peas, three pounds sugar, one pint vinegar, one tablespoonful whole cloves, one tablespoonful whole allspice...

PICKLED CAULIFLOWER.—This may be put among a jar of onions or kept by itself. Take fine, an equal measure of salt, and after sprinkling liberally with salt, pour boiling water over them...

CROW-CROW PICKLE.—Chop up a peck of green tomatoes, half a peck of ripe tomatoes, three cabbages, a dozen green peppers and half a dozen onions...

SWEET PICKLES.—Boil together for fifteen minutes, one pint of cider vinegar, and two and three-quarters lbs. of sugar for each six pounds of fruit...

CUCUMBER PICKLES.—No 1.—To 100 cucumbers add one pint, five salt dissolved in boiling water and pour on them hot. Let stand twenty-four hours...

No. 2.—Pick cucumbers not over two weeks in length, wash well and place in glass jars. Heat cider vinegar (a pint is enough for a quart can) to the boiling point...

No. 3.—Cover cucumbers with boiling water and stand 24 hours. Pour off water and add 2 lbs. sugar and 1 lb. vinegar to each quart of cucumbers...

No. 4.—Wash cucumbers and rub with salt. Mix a weak lye and vinegar solution with 1/2 lb. sugar and 1/4 lb. vinegar to each quart of cucumbers...
