NO GREEK SHIPS ARE REACHING NEW YORK

New York, Jan. 11.—Failure of King Constantine to accede to the demands of the Entente Allies has resulted in a virtual blockade of the Greek shipping here it became known last night. No Greek ships have arrived in this port in several weeks and none have sailed away.

Several Greek ships which put into Bermuda for coal, according to reports here, have been seized by the British. The steamship Themistocles which for three weeks has been anchored off the Statue of Liberty here, has taken on board about 4000 tons of general cargo. Officials of the line which owns the vessel said they believed the King of Greece would soon comply with the demands of the Entente and that the Themistocles could then put to sea.

The officials said the action of the British authorities several days ago in permitting the steamship Paris to proceed from Gibraltar, after having been detained there two months, indicated that an understanding soon would be reached.

Chicago, Jan. 11.—"Women are free from the grosser vices such as smoking, chewing and drinking, but are addicted to social vices, gossip, frivolity, clothes and small talk," said Rev. D. H. Paine, of Monmouth, Ill., in explaining that "women are no better than men."

AGAINST INCREASE IN FRIGHTFULNESS

Amsterdam, Jan. 11.—The German Socialist Vorwarts Association has declared emphatically against unrestricted submarine warfare, according to a Berlin dispatch to the Rheinische Westphalische Zeitung, of Essen. The dispatch quotes Herr Hebert, a Socialist member of the Reichstag, as saying at a meeting of the organization on January 8:

"We expect the German government to leave no stone unturned in support of President Wilson's efforts for peace. On no condition must our relations with neutrals risk being prejudiced by unrestricted warfare."

SENATOR DAVIS ILL

Prince Albert, Sask., Jan. 11.—Senator Davis is seriously ill at his home here. He has been unconscious a good deal during the past thirty-six hours and though his condition is slightly improved today, it is still quite grave.

PERLEY PRESIDED

London, Jan. 10.—Sir George Perley today presided over an entertainment at the People's Palace of a thousand poor children from the east end of London. The entertainment was provided by funds from Hamilton, Vancouver and Victoria. Sir Richard McBride was among those present.

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATION

Coal mining rights of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the North-West Territories and in a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years renewable for a further term of 21 years at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres will be leased to one applicant.

Application for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only, restricted by Chap. 27 of 44 George V. assented to 12th June, 1914.
