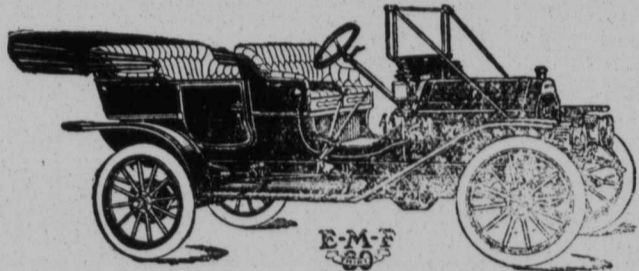

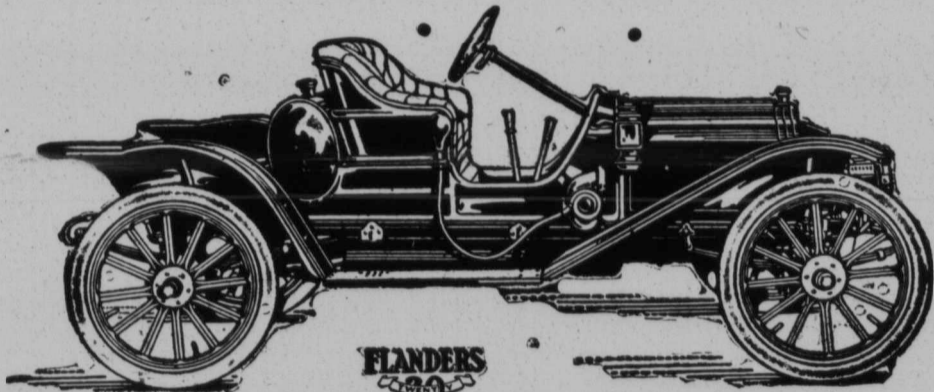

## OBITUARY

WILLIAM F. ROSS

Mr. William F. Ross passed into the undiscovered country from whose horns no glorified traveller wishes to return after an earthly pilgrimage of eighty-three years and twenty one days and an illness of nearly three weeks at his home in Hopetown, Que., on Friday morning, May 5th, 1911. Deceased was favorably known in the locality where he lived and surrounding districts, and only one member of his family is left Mr. John D. Ross aged eighty-five, a brother.

Mr. Ross was married twice, his second wife was Miss Mary Thompson who died over three years ago. Seven of his children have predeceased him. The remaining are Mrs. Margaret McGie, Vancouver, B. C.; Mr. John Ira Ross, Dalhousie Junction, N. B.; Mrs. Thos. Cumming, Armstrong, B. C.; W. C. Ross and Mrs. Ida Calbac, Sherbrooke; and Misses Jane and Euphemia Ross at the old home.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Presbyterian church where the service was conducted by Rev. G. P. Tattler, Rev. J. Prout assisted with the singing and Mrs. Prout acted as organist.

From the church the remains were borne to the little cemetery below the road and laid to rest to awake the glorious resurrection. The carriers were John D. Ross, Jr., Jos. Thompson, James Ross and Farquhar Ross. Nephews, Messrs. Elias Ross and Ronald McRae.

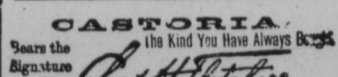
