PROGRESSIVES MAY GO OVER TO SIDE OF THE GOVERNMENT

A special Ottawa despatch to L'Evenement states that in well informed political circles in the capital it is affirmed that 52 progressive members, partisans of Hon. T.A. Crerar, remained in Ottawa a few days after prorogation and offered to go over to the Liberal side of the House at the next session.

The despatch reads in part as follows:

These 52 Progressive members would, it appears, be ready to join the Liberal party, unconditionally apart from the understanding that later on two of their number would be taken into the cabinet. The conversion of these Progressives is attributed to Hon. A.B. Hudson, and he would also be taken into the cabinet and would become the leader of the Progressive group who are prepared to join the Government ranks.

Hon. Mr. King looks with favor upon this alliance which would assure him an imposing majority.

"If the Government had 52 additional members on its side it would have an overwhelming majority and with such the King Government would not call elections before two years at least, and perhaps even three years after redistribution of the electoral divisions.

This projected alliance will probably be studied by the King cabinet next week. It is stated that all the ministers do not approve, but if the alliance be realized, the old party system will be restored for it will sound the death-knell of the Progressive group in parliament."

ANOTHER DRAIN ON THE EAST TO HARVEST WEST CROP

Forty-one thousand harvesters will be required to handle the prairie crops this year, exclusive of those to be obtained from prairie cities and towns, it was announced today following a meeting of representatives of the railways, labor commissioners and the grain trade interests. The rate of wages discussed were \$3.50 a day for harvesters and \$4.00 a day for threshers.

The harvester excursions will commence to arrive in Winnipeg from eastern Canada August 7 and will continue until August 25.

FIRE PREVENTION DAY OCTOBER 9

Because of the great loss of life and property damage by fire during the past decade, the Government by proclamation is calling upon all citizens to exercise special care and to observe October 9 as fire prevention day.

According to the proclamation, citizens will be required to inspect their dwellings and remove all articles that are likely to cause a fire.

The proclamation recommends the holding of fire drills in the schools and for the employees of all large stores and factories.

Special instructions in fire prevention is recommended to be given by school teachers, municipal officers and boy scout leaders. In the bush, operators of lumber camps, settlers, campers hunters will be required to acquaint themselves with the regulations governing the prevention of fire. There is also a recommendation that all legislation and regulations dealing with fire prevention be given proper publicity.

HOUSE FLIES KILL CHILDREN

Three Become Suddenly Ill—Two Die in Agony—Doctor's Baffled.

Milton, Nov. 17—As the result of a strange disease, the origin of which is baffling the doctors in this part of Ontario, two children belonging to a well-known family of Nassagaweya township, near Milton, have died in agony.

Two weeks ago three of the five children became suddenly ill with the disease, which was accompanied by convulsions. Dr. McNiven of Acton was called, but was unable to diagnose the case. Dr. Howitt of Guelph was then sent for, and he, too was baffled, as were other physicians who have since been called.

The first child, a girl of 15 months, passed away a few days ago, and the second, a three year old boy, was buried yesterday. The third child, a boy five years old, is still seriously ill.

Dr. Howitt believes the sickness was caused by a fly carrying a contagious disease, and depositing it on apples which were eaten by the three children. The lining of the bowels of the two children who died came off, and their bodies were reduced to skin and bones.

Dr. Grant Fleming, Deputy Medical Officer of Health for Toronto, stated yesterday he did not think these children were suffering from any unknown disease. The condition of wasting of abdominal tissue, he said, was not unusual in cases of children violently infected through fly-tainted milk or food. He thought their symptoms resembled an acute form of sickness common among children in summer.

WAR TAX STAMP TO BE AFFIXED AFTER AUG. 1

According to the post office weekly bulletin on and after August 1, 1922, the war tax stamps to be affixed on money orders issued in Canada will be: Two cents on orders drawn for sums not exceeding \$50; four cents on orders drawn for sums over \$50. The bulletin also states that merchandise liable for customs duty is not to be sent to Belgium in the letter mails.

To Conclude New Trade Treaty Between Canada And France

Hon. W.S. Fielding, Minister of Finance and Hon. Ernest Lapointe Minister of Marine and Fisheries, who with Hon. P.C. Larkin, Canadian High Commissioner in London, are Canadian delegates to the assembly of the League of Nations at Geneva, expect to sail from Quebec by the Empress of Scotland on August 22. Following the assembly, they will proceed to Paris in connection with the negotiating for the conclusion of a new trade treaty between Canada and France. Subsequently Mr. Lapointe will return to Geneva as Canadian Government delegate to the International Labor Conference also held under the auspices of the League of Nations.

Health Department Demanding Payments From Municipalities

Demands have been served upon the secretary treasurers of six municipalities in N.B. on behalf of the Provincial Department of public health calling upon them to pay over amounts for which judgments have been secured, the total of which is between \$20,000 and \$30,000.

It was stated in official circles that if the six recalcitrant municipalities declined to pay, as demanded, steps would be taken to enforce payment. The public health act provides for the arrest of secretary treasurers of municipalities which fail to pay assessments and extreme measures of that kind, it was said, would soon be taken unless payments are made.

The counties which have failed to pay and of which amounts are now being demanded are Albert, King's, Queen's, Sunbury, Kent and Northumberland.
