R. report by Chief Superintendent of Education for 1870.

We have been favoured, through the prompt consideration of the Hon. Mr. Gow, with the annual report of the Normal, Model, Grammar and Common Schools of Ontario for the year 1870...

The total receipts for all common schools purposes for the year were nearly two millions of dollars...

The expenditure of these, nearly two millions is accounted for in the following manner:—\$1,222,681 have been paid teachers as salaries...

The number of children of school age in the Province is reckoned to be 483,966, and of these 420,488 attended school for a longer or shorter period of the year...

In the 4,566 schools reported, 5,165 teachers have been employed, of whom 2,753 are males, and 2,412 females.

The largest salary paid to any male teacher in a county is \$600, the lowest \$100; in a city, highest \$1,000, lowest \$250; in a town, highest \$1,000, lowest \$225; in an incorporated village, highest \$1,000, lowest \$364.

On page 7 the Chief Superintendent argues in favor of giving school prizes and merit cards.

The number of Roman Catholic Separate Schools is 163, showing a decrease of two during the year. To these \$8,906 were apportioned from the legislative grant to separate schools...

following result:—Number of educational institutions in the province, 4,970; number of students and pupils attending them, 459,161; amount expended for all educational purposes, \$2,173,711, showing an increase of \$113,927; amount available, \$2,414,056.

We cannot enter upon the other matters contained in this document, although all of them are interesting. A considerable portion of it is devoted to an exposition of the School Laws Improvement Act of 1871.

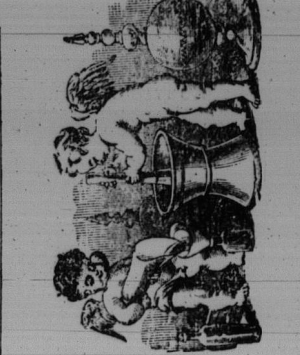
