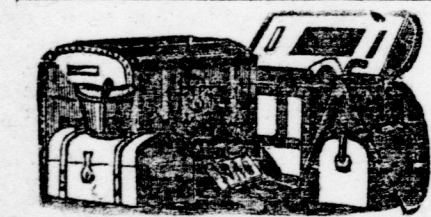

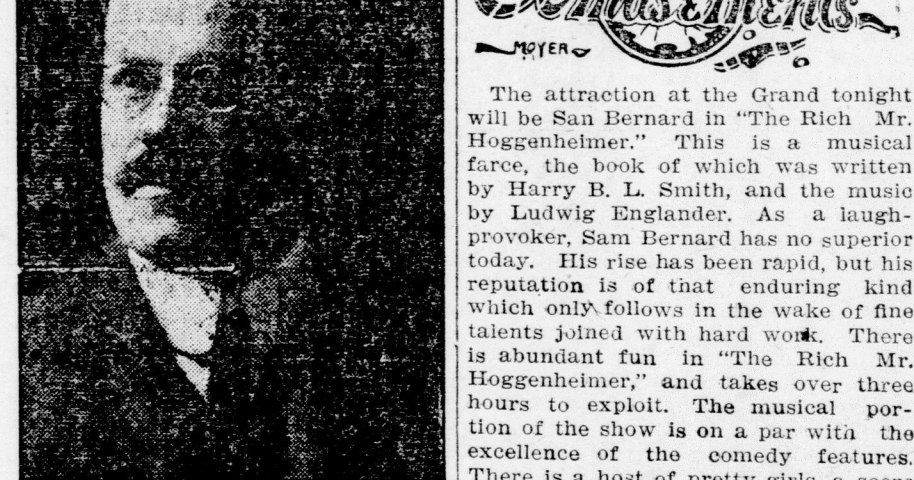

The parties were divided last night, those captained by Mr. Macpherson being seated at two tables, where blue



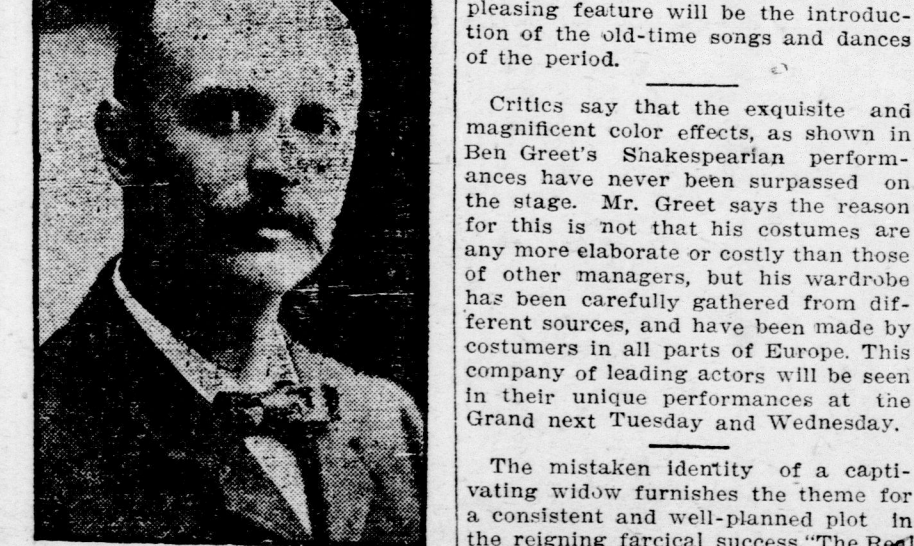
VICE-PRESIDENT C. T. GLASS.

SUNDAY CAR DEBATE

Held in Hyatt Avenue Church the Other Evening.

"Resolved that Sunday street cars are not a necessity," was the subject of a debate in the Epworth League of the Hyatt Avenue Methodist Church.

The speakers of the affirmative were heartily cheered for their splendid points, and those of the negative for their strenuous efforts to uphold their cause.

The following were among the points of the affirmative:
1.—That which breaks the law of God is not a necessity. Read Exodus, xx, 8, and Catholic catechism, lesson 6, No. 3, (Butler's).

2.—It has been proved that pleasure is the main object of the majority of the natives there, and in an interview which was printed in a Bengal paper he is reported to have stated that the condition of Eastern Bengal is worse than that of Russia.

He is also said to have declared that the atrocities committed by officials would, if they were known, evoke more horror in England than the Turkish outrages in Armenia.
