REDMOND REVOLTS

ON BUDGET BILL

London, June 9.—John E. Redmond, the Nationalist leader, hoisted the signal of revolt in the course of the debate in the House of Commons this afternoon on the second reading of the financial bill.

He notified the Government bluntly that the Nationalist party would vote against the budget on the ground that it was grossly unfair to Ireland and constituted a breach of the act of union.

Mr. Redmond's objection was to the proposed increases in the taxes on whisky, which he characterized as a crushing imposition on one of Erin's few remaining industries.
