PRICES WERE FIRM ON LOCAL MARKET

But Very Little of Hay and Oats Offered on Square Today.

HAY SOLD UP TO \$16.25

Highest Since the Spring—Fruit Has Practically Disappeared—The Quotations This Morning.

There was a very small market this morning, hay and oats being the only commodities offered, and these in comparatively small quantities. The market for such a condition was a very firm market in regard to prices. Hay was sold at \$16 for good quality, while one sale was made for \$16.25, the highest price offered since the spring. Oats were sold at a very strong demand for both hay and oats all week, and very little has been offered to meet the demand. There does not seem a likelihood of any decided drop, as this morning less than a dozen loads of hay were offered, and twice that amount could be disposed of. Oats were strong, with a very good demand. The prevailing price this morning was \$1.30, and very little offered. Other grains were not represented at the market at all, though there has been a strong demand for some time for barley, buckwheat and rye for some time. The fruit market was practically unrepresented this morning, as the bulk of grapes at from 15c to 25c, according to quality, found a very slow sale, while quinces were selling from 5c to 10c. Otherwise nothing was offered.
