





## THEFT.

June 5-Edward Roy, charged with stealing twelve dollars from Henry Laurette; charge withdrawn.

June 17-Thomas Smith, charged with stealing coal from Frank Blair. Case dismissed.

June 17-Robert Ackles, charged with stealing clothes from Charles Savoie; charge withdrawn June 21-Donald Wilson, charged with stealing fourteen dollars from Joseph Merrell. Case dismissed.

June 21-James Lefurgey, charged with stealing watch and chain from William Noble. Charge . withdrawn.

July 29-Joseph Roy, charged with stealing ten dollars, the property of Joseph Hachey. Charge withdrawn.
