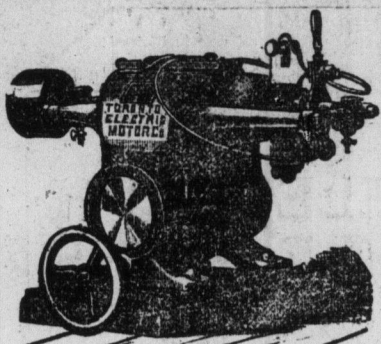

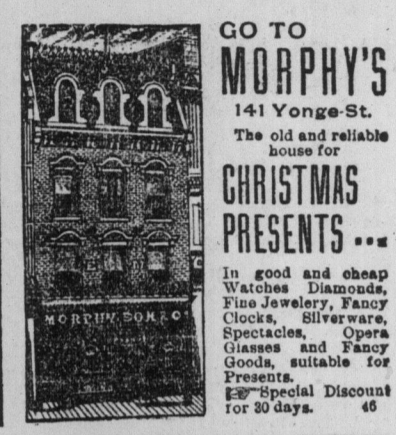

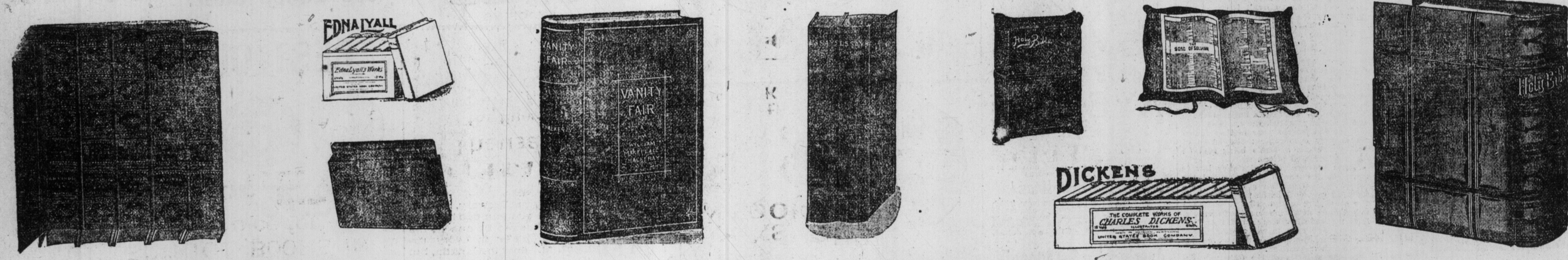

OLDEST PLAN OF THE CITY.

Board of Works Presents an Engraving of the Library.
Mr. Miles Vokes presided at the meeting of the Public Library Board yesterday afternoon. The other members present were: Messrs. John Taylor, Frank Somers, James Kerr, H. T. Kelly, W. D. McPherson, C. J. McCabe and A. R. Boswell. In accordance with the recommendation of the Library Committee, 250 books will be purchased at a cost of \$280. Orders for the payment of \$280 on account of building and finance were made.
Librarian Bain stated that the Board of Works had presented to the library the oldest plan of the city and Liberties of Toronto, made by order of the Survey-General in 1825. This old, framed engraving will henceforth be displayed on the Library walls instead of at the City Hall.
Thanks were voted the Board of Works for their gift, and also to the executors of the late Rev. D. Fordyce of Verges for a bequest of books on the genealogy and history of Scotland. The board were glad to find that the library was appreciated outside Toronto.

U.S.A. EXHIBITION.

A number of good Pictures by Toronto Artists.
The Art Union exhibit of pictures by the Ontario Society of Artists opened yesterday afternoon at the Art Gallery, King-street west. A large number of ladies and gentlemen visited the exhibition, and the president, Hon. G. W. Allen, made a short speech. The collection is not large and is made up chiefly of outdoor summer with comparatively few wrought-up studio pictures. Hence landscapes predominate and the water-colorists keep up their end better than the painters in oil. Mr. R. P. Gagen's "Under the Birchies, W. Goldboro, Maine," occupies the principal position and is notable for its charming color and delicate handling. Messrs. C. M. Manly, C. W. Jeffrey, M. Matthews, F. Verrier, T. H. Williams, Henry Martin and others display good water-colors. The collection of oils contains a very striking work, "In the Dykelands," by E. M. Bell-Smith, renders sunbath as they make it in Holland effectively. The same artist exhibits a portrait which is a striking effect in scarlet; too well handled to be noisy. Miss Sidney Tully exhibits a pastel portrait of similar effect in bright mauve; it lacks severity of treatment.
Mr. J. W. Foster's portrait of a pretty woman and Mr. T. M. Martin's portrait of an unfortunate bear, that are executed in the best style of both these artists. Mr. W. E. Atkinson has a group of beautiful little landscapes, rich in color and charming in execution. Mr. and Mrs. Reid, F. S. Challener, F. McGillivray Knowles, W. A. Sherwood, Miss Oestera and Miss Ford also send interesting work. All the pictures will be disposed of by allotment.

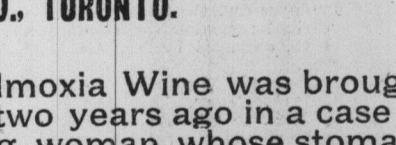
