

WILLSON STEWART DIED VERY SUDDENLY

Struck By Stroke Yesterday Afternoon; Well Known Here and London Township.

William B. Stewart, one of London's best known citizens, died very suddenly yesterday afternoon about 2 o'clock, when he dropped dead on Carling street, near Talbot. Mr. Stewart was out for his afternoon walk and was suddenly seized with a stroke, which ended his life. Physicians were called, but Mr. Stewart had succumbed before they arrived, and he was removed to his late residence, 425 Kensington street.

Deceased was born in Scotland 72 years ago and came to Canada 50 years ago. For a number of years he conducted a harness business at Granton and Lucan, where he was well known and highly respected. For the past 14 years he has resided in this city, and for a time conducted a harness business here. He was a member of First Presbyterian Church and a member of the Odd Fellows' Lodge, of Granton, and had been a lifelong Liberal.

Besides his widow he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. George Sumner and Mrs. George Zwicker; three sons, Mr. G. Stewart, K. C. Stewart and W. M. Stewart, all of this city.

The funeral, which will be held under the auspices of the Odd Fellows' Order, will take place from his late residence tomorrow afternoon.

BETTER HURRY AND GET 1922 LICENSE

Out of 11,000 Auto Owners in District Only 1,360 Plates Have Been Issued.

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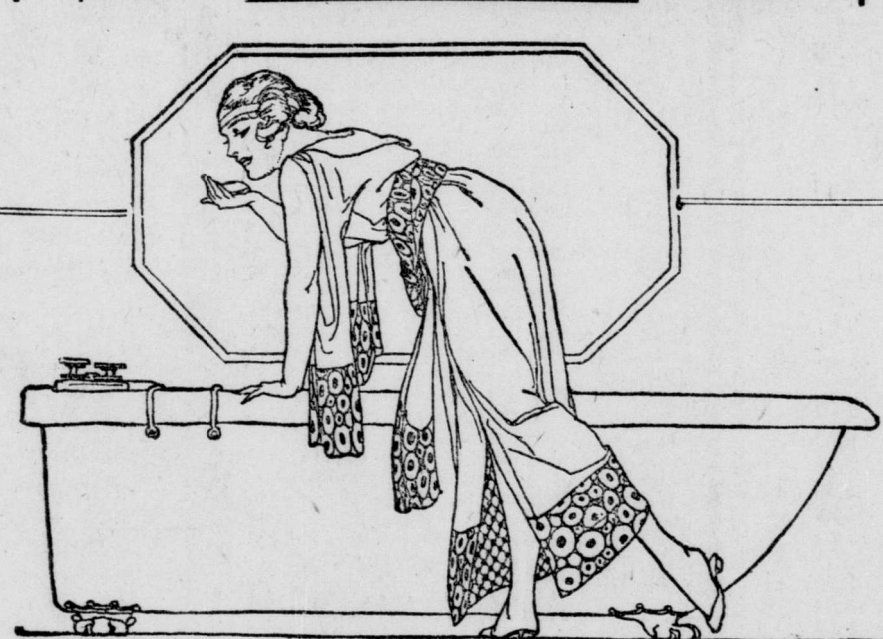
