

Michael, to the Vice Royalty of Poland. It is added that this measure, which is attributed to the influence of the Grand Duchess Helen, wife of the Grand Duke Michael, with the Emperor Nicholas, will be carried into execution on the Emperor's return to the capital.

According to a letter from Switzerland, in the *Courier Francais*, Prince Louis Bonaparte, who remains at Archenberg, has received from the Grand Duke of Baden a formal notice not to set foot within the Grand Duchy, nor even to pass through the town of Constance.
