

APPLE JELLY.—Ball till it becomes a per-fect felly one pound of moist sugar, one pound of apples, the Juice of one lemon, Let it stand in a mould till quite firm and

SEA FOAM.—Whitesof ten eggs beaten to a till fruit, one-and-one half cups of sifted augar, one cup sifted flour, one teaspoonful cream tartar; put into sings and bake quick.

SFICE CARE.—One-and-one-half cups but-ter, three cups singer, one cup sour milk, hve cups flour, five eggs, one teaspoon sode; can-namon. cloves, nutmeg, allspice, each one teaspoon; one pound raisins.

APPLE TOAST.—Pare and core tart apples without breaking them, put them on slices of stale bread, ful them with sugar, put a little butter and spice on each one, and bake them tender in a moderate oven.
