Panopepton as a Temporary Food

FOR INFANTS AND CHILDREN

There is no mistaking the good results from the use of Panopepton as a temporary food for infants and children in the summer diarrhœas. Time and time again it is to be noted in clinical reports that immediate improvement followed the administration of the first few drops of Panopepton; that approaching inanition gave way to animation; that unrest was succeeded by quietude, and the little patient turned subjectively toward recovery; that medication then became effective, and all the conditions were changed for the better.
