GOVERNMENT RESPONSE

The Government of Canada thanks the Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and International Trade and the Committee on Human Rights and International Development for its May 2012 report entitled "Conflict, Human Rights and Democracy in Colombia: A Canadian Agenda". The report, based on 11 months of public consultations, makes an important contribution to the ongoing discussion of Canada's role in Colombia and provides valuable direction and guidance for policy decisions of the future.

GOVERNMENT RESPONSE 1

We appreciate the effort made by the Sub-Committee to call witnesses with a range of views in order to get as complete a picture as possible of the Colombian situation. We also commended the Sub-Committee for its report, released in February 2012, to gain further insight by hearing first-hand from Colombians themselves.
