of known reserves, Canada could experience shortages in the neature unless other sources can be brought into production. The National Energy Board is studying this and will be reporting to the Government.

This whole situation shows how complex and, at times, difficult our bilateral relations have become. In these circumstances, it is all the more important that both sides strive to maintain what is fundamentally a healthy, friendly and mutually-benefici relationship. It is essential that, as appropriate, prior notification, discussion, consultation and negotiation play a central role in the management of relations between the United States at Canada. To this end, it is vital that each country have an accounterstanding of what the other is trying to accomplish, and the each have the opportunity to put forward its own concerns for consideration by the other. That is why I have sought to explait to you Canadian policies on foreign investment and energy, two areas of vital interest to Canada and the United States.
